



Mid-Missouri Chapter

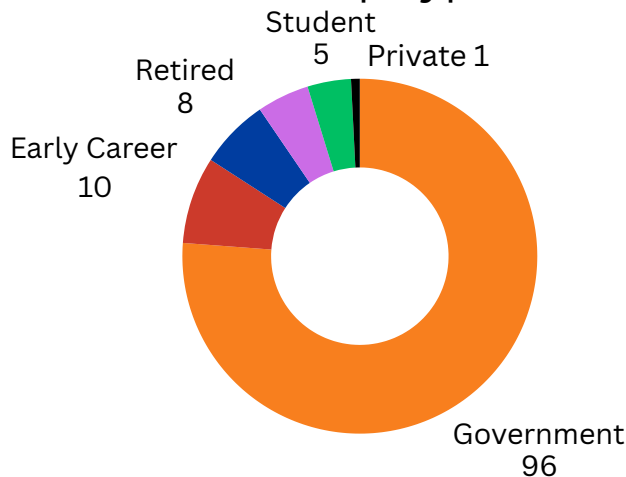

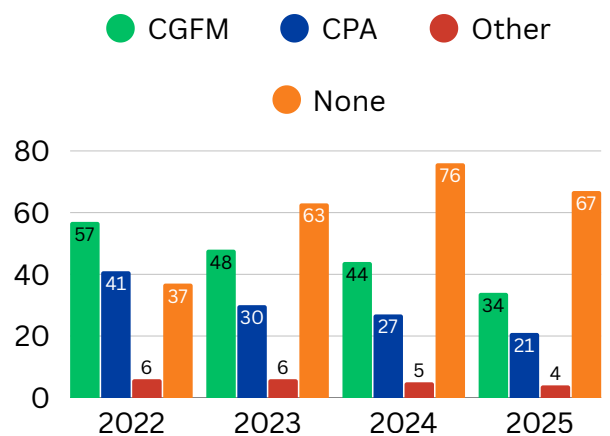

Chapter Vision: To represent the premier association for advancing government accountability in our community

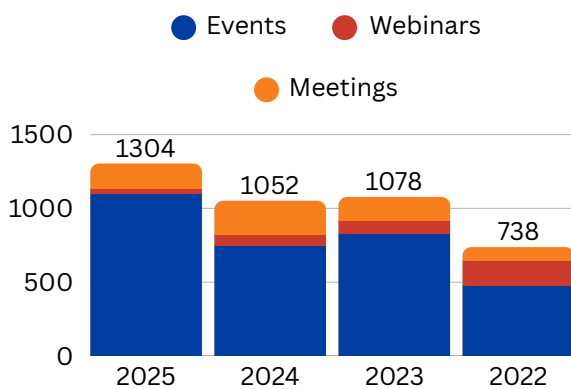
Membership Types

Over the last year, the Chapter saw a decrease in membership of 26 members or 17%. While retirement is related to some decline, the larger reason is lack of support by the major employer in the area. While this decline is a concern, we are also seeing a dramatic drop in CGFMs of 10 members or 23%. Without support from the Chapter's major employer for either membership or certification, we have seen drastic decline over the last 10 years.

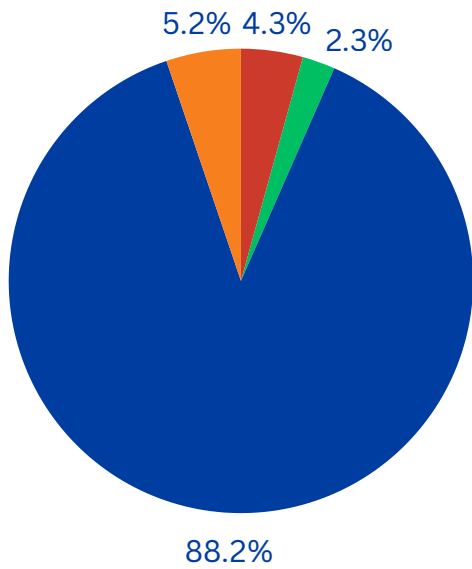

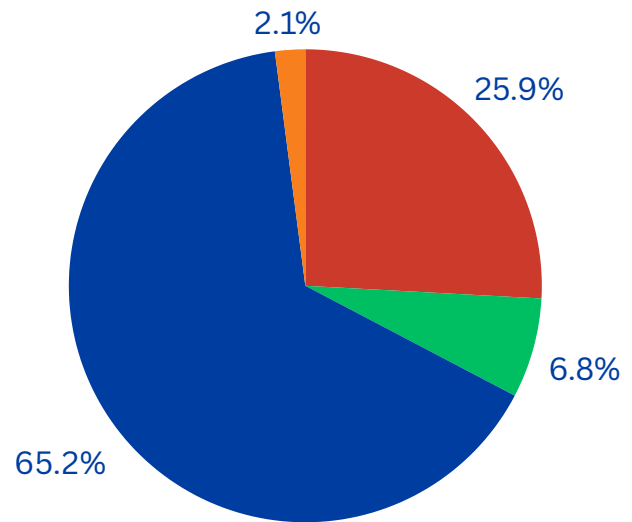

Program Year 2024-2025 revenue and expenditures continued to improve from the COVID slump. While we continue to offer around 40 CPE annually, it is now based on a combination of both virtual and in-person sessions. During 2025, we returned to a hotel conference space for our PDT which caused the rise in Education expenditures. The new revenue source for Members starting in 2024 is the result of resuming a Chapter membership fee of \$10. Upgrading our website and moving to an annual website service fee caused the spike in Administrative expenditures beginning in 2023. Chapter travel costs to attend the National PDT continues to be the other main Administrative cost.

The Mid-Missouri Chapter has internal control procedures in place to safeguard funds and provide efficient and effective management of assets. Our financial review is scheduled but not completed as of the date of publication.
